- Grading of other commodities by request prior to commencement of training (requests for additional commodities other than corn, soybeans and wheat must be made at time of registration).
- Update on any changes to the grading system
- Overview & demonstration of rapid DON testing
- Grading examination and, if successful, issuance of a <u>Level 3 Grading Certificate</u>

- Update on any changes to the grading system
