- ➔ **Beginner Workshop** – the beginner workshop is intended for those who have not attended one of the beginner workshops before and do not have significant grain grading experience. The workshop is intended to familiarize attendees with the major grading factors in wheat, soybeans, corn (and where interested canola). Focus will be put on hands-on learning.
- ➔ **Refresher Workshop** – the refresher is intended for those who have previously attended a beginner training workshop, or those with significant grain grading experience who would like a review/refresher. Focus will be wheat, soybeans, corn (and where interested canola).

Grain Grading Workshop

Items covered during the workshop...

1. Grading review of all classes of eastern Canadian wheat including the ability to recognize and assess all grading factors as outlined in the Canadian Grain Commission's Grain Grading Guide
2. Grading review of soybeans including the ability to recognize and assess all grading factors as outlined in the Canadian Grain Commission's Grain Grading Guide
3. Grading review of corn including the ability to recognize and assess all grading factors as outlined in the Canadian Grain Commission's Grain Grading Guide
4. (Where requested by session participants) Grading review of canola including the ability to recognize and assess all grading factors as outlined in the Canadian Grain Commission's Grain Grading Guide
5. The use of Canadian Grain Commission standards and guides and how they relate to subjective grading factors for wheat and soybeans
6. An understanding of the types and usages of basic grain grading equipment used in the grading of Canadian wheat, soybeans, corn and canola
7. A basic understanding of the Canadian Grain Commission Grain Grading Guide and its applications in grading Canadian grain
8. Overview of sampling equipment and procedures designed to obtain a representative sample
9. Overview of equipment and procedures designed to assess deoxynivalenol (DON)/vomitoxin using Neogen Smart DON.

The **full-day beginner workshop** will expand on the above items with lots of hands-on opportunity.

The **half-day refresher workshop** will be a fast paced, condensed version of the above for review/refresher purposes. **Note: The refresher session is not intended for first time attendees or those with minimal grading experience.**
